YWCA Program Presented to Starlight Group at Clair



Lauren Stafford, Bliss Transitional Housing Care Manager from the YWCA, gave an overview of available programs they offer to victims of domestic abuse in our community. These programs include: 1) Emergency Shelter; 2) Crisis Hotline (domestic violence, rape, child abuse); 3) Choices and Decisions for middle school kids; 4) Discovery Childcare; 5) Healthy Teen Parents/Healthy Babies; 6) GRIT Center for Growing Resilient Independent Teens; 7) Community Support Services which provides housing assistance and advocates for hospital, law enforcement and court; and 8) Bliss Manor transitional housing and permanent supportive housing for survivors.

cies with needed food/first aid kits/personal care kits, etc. This year, there is a special need for Flood Buckets! Each kit includes:

1-5 gallon bucket with resealable lid 1-32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry soap 1-16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner *No spray cleaners 1-16-34 oz. bottle dish soap 1–4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener 1-6-14 oz. pump spray insect repellant -pack of 10-20 wipes acceptable too *Pump sprays must have protective covers1 scrub brush (with or without handle) 18 re-useable cleaning wipes *No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels *Remove from packaging 5 scouring pads (no stainless steel pads w/ soap) *Remove from packaging 36-50 clothespins 1–50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic) 24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45 gal.) *Remove from packaging 5 N95 dust masks (1-3mm thickness) 2 pairs kitchen gloves *Remove from packaging 1 pair work gloves (cotton w/leather palm or all leather)
