Hurricane Idalia made landfall in Florida, bringing flooding and damage, and then headed to Georgia and the Carolinas.

UMCOR processed a grant for the The Florida Conference of The United Methodist Church for emergency supplies. In



anticipation of the hurricane, UMCOR staff conducted a 2-hour workshop for Cabinet members and conference leadership to review the conference disaster response plan. Donation drop off – 9:30-11:30 AM. You may volunteer to help sort and package donations that day. The Festival provides numerous agencies with needed food/first aid kits/personal care kits, etc. This year, there is a special need for Flood Buckets! Each kit includes:

- 1-5 gallon bucket with resealable lid
- 1-32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry soap
- 1-16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner
- \*No spray cleaners
- 1-16-34 oz. bottle dish soap
- 1–4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener
- 1-6-14 oz. pump spray insect repellant -pack of 10-20 wipes acceptable too
- \*Pump sprays must have protective covers
- 1 scrub brush (with or without handle)
- 18 re-useable cleaning wipes
- \*No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels
- \*Remove from packaging
- 5 scouring pads (no stainless steel pads w/ soap)
- \*Remove from packaging
- 36-50 clothespins
- 1–50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic)
- 24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45 gal.)
- \*Remove from packaging
- 5 N95 dust masks (1-3mm thickness)
- 2 pairs kitchen gloves
- \*Remove from packaging
- 1 pair work gloves (cotton w/leather palm or all leather)







We have two more Sundays in the CONNECT worship series. This coming Sunday, Sept. 10 will have us focusing on the membership vow of SERVICE; and Sept. 17 on the vow of WITNESS. I am so excited about our upcoming Capital Campaign. Roxyann Schreiber created a wonderful display to highlight the projects completed in the last few years and the projects we hope to complete in the months ahead. Those projects include remodeling the entrance to the church building to be more spacious and welcoming. A lighting project will increase light on the chancel, light the outdoor cross and flag and our Clair Church sign on the church lawn. A ramp to the chancel will allow everyone to access the chancel area. We look forward to new flooring throughout the building except in the sanctuary, a facelift for the kitchen with new flooring and countertops, and fresh coats of paint throughout the building. Replacing the east door with a safety door and an AED unit completes our wish list. We estimate addressing all of these projects will cost close to \$90,000.

The Building Team of Brendon Clark, Ceressa Kent and Rod Sander have been working with me and the Ad Council to define the scope of our project and to plan the capital campaign to fund the work we want to do. Those folks have already made their pledges which total nearly \$37,000!

You will be hearing more about the projects in the weeks ahead and there will be opportunities to have your questions answered. Pledge cards for you will be available on Sept. 24. We would like to have pledge cards returned by Oct. 15 so that we can tally and celebrate the total at the Harvest Home celebration.

It's an exciting time, Friends! I ask that you begin to prayerfully consider the amount you can give to the Capital Campaign Fund over the next three years to make this project a reality.


