I graduated from Central High school, St. Joseph Junior College, attended NWSC, and MWSC -graduating in the first class at Missouri Western with a BS in Education.

I am a retired elementary teacher. I have taught grades 2, 4, and 5. I taught both of my kids in 2nd grade at Helena. I also taught reading part-time after I retired. I taught 34 years in the Savannah R-3 School District.

hunger in the St. Joseph area together! TOUCH DOWN CLAIR CHURCH!


