I really enjoyed our worship together last Sunday – talking about prayer, singing about prayer, and actually praying throughout the service. Here's a reminder of the prayer tricks we highlighted.

Use the word ACTS to help with a well-rounded prayer. A = Adoration. Tell God how awesome God is! C = Confession. Tell God about your sins. Say you are sorry and ask for forgiveness and help in moving forward. T = Thanksgiving. Say "thank you!" S = Supplication. Pray for others in their needs.

The 5 Finger Prayer: Pinkie finger reminds us of the "least of these among us." Ring finger – pray for those closest to us – our nearest and dearest. Middle finger is the tallest. Pray for our elected leaders, government leaders, emergency personnel, military personnel. Index finger points the way. Pray for those who point the way for you – teachers, coaches, supervisors, mentors, pastors. Your thumb is the finger closest to you. Pray for yourself.

We also prayed a Litany of Reconciliation from the Protestant chapel at the memorial at Dachau, Germany. Out of the ruins of the bombed cathedral in Coventry, England, came a call for forgiveness, not just for those who bombed the church, but for all humanity. For, as scripture reminds us, all of us have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. In response to a request for the litany, I invite you to include this in your prayers from time to time.

#### The Coventry Litany of Reconciliation

All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23)

The hatred which divides nation from nation, race from race, class from class;

#### Father, forgive.

The covetous desires of people and nations to possess what is not their own;

#### Father, forgive.

The greed which exploits the work of human hands and lays waste the earth;

#### Father, forgive.

Our envy of the welfare and happiness of others;

#### Father, forgive.

Our indifference to the plight of the imprisoned, the homeless, the refugee;

#### Father, forgive.

The lust which dishonors the bodies of men, women, and children;

#### Father, forgive;

The pride which leads us to trust in ourselves and not in God;

Father, forgive.

Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. (Ephesians 4:32)

# **Adopted Family Program Begins November 27**

Clair's congregation adopts two large families and 2-3 singles (may be elderly, mentally handicapped, nursing home residents through the AFL-CIO's Christmas Program. Items listed for each member of the families will be available for selection beginning November 27. Deadline to have the gifts back to Clair is December 18. The congregation takes tags which tell them the name of the recipient, the family identifying number, the item and size (if clothing) they need. A gift is purchased and wrapped. The name of the recipient and the family identifying number must be on the new package tag. We



take money donations for food vouchers to give to the families and sometimes to an individual - depending on the situation. Food vouchers are in the amounts of \$60 or \$80 each. This allows the families to obtain certain food items from a local grocery store. Clair divides the delivery duties up and delivers to the families' homes the week of Christmas.
