

Our family knew Pastor Cindy from her appointment at Bethany UMC – where my brother served also. Cindy has always been a part of our family for sure! I am truly blessed to be a part of Clair UMC!

One of my greatest joys here at Clair is to be able to be of service in the capacity of Children and Youth Leader!
