In January of 2021, Pastor Cindy, myself (Debbie Wells) and Michelle Clark committed to a year-long training program on Stewardship. Zoom sessions are led by Dr. Laura Murphy of the United Methodist Foundation and our "study group" is made up of other United Methodist churches which are like in size, etc.

The study group "meets" once a month for instruction and discussion. There is homework assigned at each session to be completed before the next meeting. Churches were given a list of books dedicated to the expression of giving within the church. Each church selected one to read and summarize.

I was not overly anxious about participating in this study. Stewardship has long been a hard subject to talk about and present. But I am glad I made the commitment. We are delving into what stewardship/giving really means. To say it means raising funds does the word and concept a great injustice.


