

### Shanna Frank: She's Not in Kansas Anymore!



Shanna Eggers Frank has been a lifelong Kansan. She grew up on a farm in rural Woodson County (southeastern Kansas) and then moved to Emporia to attend college. She lived primarily in Emporia, with a two-year stint in Lawrence, until moving to St. Joseph when she and Phillip were married November 26, 2021. She was raised in a Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod.

Shanna works for Emporia State University. She's worked in their TRIO programs – federally funded grant programs serving first-generation, low-income students in their pursuit of higher education – since her undergraduate days at ESU. She has worked with students in 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades (college preparatory programs) and undergraduate students. She currently serves as the director of the McNair Scholars Program that she wrote and obtained for the university in 2017. She is blessed that her supervisor has allowed her to maintain this position remotely after she moved to St. Joe. She enjoys being active in her professional association where she has served in a

variety of leadership capacities at both the state and regional level.

She enjoys baking and reading. She really wishes Phillip enjoyed her desserts more but he doesn't have nearly the sweet tooth that she does! Before getting married, Shanna also committed a lot of her time to advocating for child welfare. She was a licensed foster parent, a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteer, a leader of a foster-parent support group, and part of her prior church's Loving Hands ministry supporting foster families.

She began attending Clair occasionally with Phillip while they were dating and has attended regularly since moving to St. Joseph.

Shanna's favorite memory from Clair (so far!) is the Harvest Festival last fall when she was bidding on a loaf of bread and Phillip began bidding against her. Everyone had a good laugh and it helped raise additional money for a good cause!

She appreciates the kindness of all the Clair members and how much Pastor Cindy's sermons resonate with her.









The scripture for Sunday's worship was 1 Kings 17:8-16 – the story of the prophet Elijah and his interaction with the widow and her son in the town of Zarephath. During my time with the children during worship we talked about the widow running out of food. What do we do when we run out of food?

Go to the store and buy some.

What do we do if we don't have money to buy food?

Grow food in the garden.

Then we had conversation about the Open Door Food Kitchen, collecting food for food pantries, etc. For little boys who have had no experience with having no food in their homes, I suspect it is hard to imagine an empty refrigerator or pantry. But the conversation was a reminder for all of us to keep food pantries in mind this summer, especially as food prices rise.

Several years ago I received a call from a young mom who said she was out of food. I bought some staples at the local grocery store and delivered the food to her apartment. A little boy greeted me at the door and helped carry bags inside. The woman expressed her gratefulness as she started to put items away. I was really "got" as I saw that the refrigerator was empty – literally. There was nothing on cabinet shelves either. When she said she was out of food, she meant she was <u>out</u> of food.

So... keep those who are hungry in mind when you are shopping or when you are gathering vegetables from your garden or when you are eating a meal. Keep the widow of Zarephath and her son in mind. Let's do our part to make sure food never runs out just as God's love for us never runs out.


