I told the boys I had gone to church all my life but something was missing in my heart. I tried and tried but the Holy Spirit seemed to be missing.

We discussed how we wanted a person who had led a life of sinful ways, had discovered Christ and was reborn - living a very strong Christian life. Brad stated that person is Phil Roberston of Duck Dynasty. Hoss contacted Phil and a date of March 21<sup>st</sup> was set.

It is a day none of us will forget and that day changed our lives. Our family: Bruce, Dylan, Brad, his wife Brooke, and their boys Brecken, Kenton and the three little boys headed to Monroe, Louisiana. We wanted to be baptized in the river, but it was flooded. So seven of us were baptized by submersion in the church. Phil kneeled and explained to her that she has not sinned yet or done anything to be ashamed of at her age. Piper was disappointed but Phil said to come back to see him when the temptation of alcohol and drugs came into her life.

As Phil baptized me in the name of Christ and I was lifted out of the water, a spirit entered my heart. I knew immediately it was the Holy Spirit. I have never felt such a love and peace in my life. Six of our lives changed that day. Bruce, Brad, Hoss, Dylan, Kenton and myself all felt the same thing. We all read our Bible every day and Bruce, Brad and Victor have a Zoom Bible Study every Wednesday morning.
