

Sermon Guide – June 19, 2022

Read through Matthew 5, 6, and 7 – the Sermon on the Mount.

Then contrast and compare Luke 6:17-49 – the Sermon on the Plain.

Luke 6:39-49 are described as parables on the meaning of discipleship. What lessons about discipleship do you see in these brief verses?

“The blind leading the blind” is something we say when neither person knows what they are doing or where they are going. What experiences do you have of the blind leading the blind? What does this verse teach us about discipleship?

Then Jesus draws a silly picture of a person with a log stuck in his eye. His illustration is meant to direct our attention to the problem of judging others. When have you been the victim of someone’s judgment? Or when have you been guilty of judging someone else?

This section of Luke includes verses about building upon a strong, solid foundation. “The wise man built his house upon the rock...” What do these verses mean to you? How are you building your life on a solid foundation?
